NBDW Showcase Returns!

Back by popular demand, the National Ballroom Dance Week Fall Showcase will return this year on September 17 for its 12th consecutive year.

As usual it will be held at the spacious Greensboro Shrine Club from 4 until 7 pm, for a low admission price. And as usual there will be several exciting dance performances, over 2 hours of great social dancing to specially selected recorded music, and great refreshments. Johnson will again be the event chairperson, assisted by Victoria Paterline as co-chair, Mel Paterline (enlisting performers) and several others. And there will be a need for additional volunteers; you do not need to be a Carolina Heartland member to volunteer.

Below is a note from Lib, summarizing some of the volunteer efforts needed.

Performers: We need our favorite dancers performing again. You will soon be receiving the entry form along with the reservation form, via email. Urge your favorite performers to sign up.

Publicity: We are looking for a few volunteers with fresh ideas about attracting people to the event, people to place posters in strategic places about town, and to place event notices at various online sites as well as newspapers.

Set up: Need people to help the decorating committee on day of the event. We will need a few people to cover the tables and arrange the decorations on the tables, lay out the printed programs, and a few to usher guests to the tables.

Also we need a few people to accept the food as it comes in and place it on the serving table, to serve punch, and to keep refreshing the food on the tables.

This year, our showcase will not be a part of the Greensboro 17Days arts festival, which has been moved to late October. We still expect large attendance. When flyers/reservation forms become available, send them to your friends in other parts of NC and surrounding states. This is a great Sunday day trip event, and it ends early enough that the people can get back to the Triangle and other areas before late night.

Important Chapter News

The Carolina Heartland election for board of directors will be held prior to the November 12 monthly dance. The USA Dance by-laws require an election at least every 2 years. The term of office for the 9 directors will start in January 2018 and end in December 2019.

All eligible members (current in their dues) can vote for the board, as well as volunteer to run for the board. The by-laws require the chapter members to elect the members of the board, and then the elected board will decide who the 4 officers will be as well as who will handle the other important jobs. Those jobs include membership director, as well as directors of volunteers, publicity, communications, etc.

USA Dance suggests voting for people with business and leadership abilities, as well as artistic, creative, and financial abilities. That is to ensure success of our monthly events as well as special events, such as the Black Tie and NDBW showcase, and to make sure the revenue that these events produce is well spent. Your annual dues go to support the activities of USA Dance as a whole.

As the by-laws require, a nominating and election committee has been appointed, which will handle the nominating process. By-laws allow the nominating process to be open until as late as October 2.
