Tall, slim with a natural talent for ballroom dancing, he used his business acumen to teach dancing and also in dance management with the Arthur Murray Dance Studio. He left the world of dance briefly to pursue a career in insurance but soon found dancing was a lot more fun than selling life-time policies. When Terry Walsh opened Greensboro Ballroom in 1995, he returned to dance instruction for

private and group lessons and corporate functions.

Today he has expanded his teaching of all four styles of dance to work with Greensboro Ballet, directing all of its ballroom dance classes. His favorite lessons are teaching couples in preparation for their wedding dance. Important Note On Driving To The Showcase:

If you use GPS Navigation, the address for Greensboro Shrine Club is **5010 High Point Rd.** Because of the road changes, you will now need to turn onto High Point Rd. from the new Gate City Blvd. to reach the club. However, if I-73 is convenient for you, just take exit 100 off I-73 onto Gate City Blvd., head toward Greensboro, and turn right where there is a sign pointing to “Sedgefield”. The Shrine club is about 3/4 mile from I-73. And if you are coming from Greensboro on Gate City Blvd., turn left at the “Sedgefield” sign.
